



STEWARDSHIP AND CHRISTIAN GIVING



A Biblical and Theological Perspective

The concept of stewardship arises out of the biblical teachings about creation, about the responsible and wise use of things, material resources, one's own gifts and skills, one's very self. It is related to commitment and thus is very personal. But it is also related to the world in its human and physical senses and thus is very social.

Faith and works

Stewardship has to do with life ... every bit of it. It cannot be reduced to counting out nine dill seeds for me and one for God, as some of the Scribes and Pharisees had it figured. It is where faith and works come together, as they always must in the life of discipleship. It has to do with how we earn our money, what we do with our education, the nature and extent of our expenditures, the values by which we live, what we plan to do with our resources when we are finished with them, and, yes, it does have to do with giving.

All persons are stewards

The meaning of stewardship has to do with 100% rather than 2, 3, or even 10%. All persons are stewards. The only uncertainty is what kind. It is God's house in which we live, and it is to God that we are responsible. We are his *oikonomoi* ... the Greek for stewards, custodians, housekeepers, managers. That is a word on stewardship.



We need not give up the pleasures and luxuries of this life. God does not call us to be ascetics, but he does call us to a right sense of proportion in administering our substance. The question is, "If I have this for myself, then what would I do for God?" This is the question into which the whole matter of stewardship resolves itself.

A Letter from our Church President

Sharing the Love and Teachings of Jesus through our Actions

Action is the third part of our mission statement (worship and witness have been discussed in previous newsletters). Action is defined as the process of doing something, typically to achieve a goal. Jesus distilled what Christian action means when he declared the 2nd greatest commandment: "Love your neighbor as yourself" [Matt 22:39]. What images come to mind when you think of helping a friend or neighbor, or anyone in need? Maybe it means providing comfort in a time of trouble. Perhaps it means helping with an errand or chores when needed. Maybe it's helping to make soup, quilts, or donating food to Pennridge Fish. Maybe it means giving someone a ride to church. At St. John's, we have done all of the above.]

In ancient times, God asked the Israelites to remember the poor: "You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy and poor, in your land "[Deut. 15:11]. And Jesus teaches us that whatever we do to the least of our brothers and sisters; we do so to Him [Matt. 25:35-40]. We know there are so many people who need our help, and sadly it always has been this way, and always will be, until Jesus comes again. Maybe we can't reach everyone in need, but what a difference it can make for those we can reach out to and help! There are many kinds of needs: financial, physical, mental, and spiritual. What better way to show the love of Jesus than through simple acts of kindness; such as donating a few dollars for food, donating clothing, being a good listener when someone is in anguish, or sharing a comforting scriptural passage to someone who wants to know if God still loves them?

As we worship God with our church family and care for and nurture each other, let us not forget to take time during the week to reach out to others in need, in our homes, communities, and work places. Jesus cast a very wide net when talking about who our neighbors are (think the story of the Good Samaritan, Luke 10:30-35, remembering Jews and Samaritans hated each other). Let us go out into the world and show mercy, as Jesus taught us to do.

**32st Annual Pennridge CROP Walk for
the Hungry
Sunday, October 10, 2015
Starting 1:15 PM Rain or Shine
(Registration 12:30 - 1:15 PM)**

It's time again to put on comfortable walking shoes and take a hike for hunger. Sunday, October 10th is the date for the 32nd annual Pennridge CROP Walk for the Hungry. The 5.5 mile route will begin and end at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, 20 Dill Ave., Perkaspie. Walkers are asked to bring canned good donations along for the Pennridge FISH food pantry. Entire families are encouraged to participate. Wagons and strollers are welcome! If the route becomes too tiresome, walkers can ride back to the starting point in one of several "Toe Trucks" which will circle the area throughout the afternoon. You may choose to walk the "Golden Mile" one mile loop along the Lenape Park bike path. This route has been especially designed for families with small children, senior citizens, and the differently-abled. Registration for the "Golden Mile" will take place at 12:30 PM at the scout cabin area in Sellersville. Twenty-five per cent of all funds raised will remain in the Pennridge area for local hunger use by Pennridge FISH.

The remaining funds will be used by Church World Service and its partner agencies to feed those who are hungry throughout the world. CROP Hunger Walks also play a role in the U.S., helping communities ravaged by floods and tornadoes to recover. 
