Silver Springs April Pie Day Meeting News

NOTICE: We will continue collecting Campbell's Soup Labels until the end of May. The Campbell Company has discontinued the program of refunding to schools. They will accept the labels until July 31st so I will mail labels to Silver Springs – Martin Luther School in June so they can get credit for them. Thank you to everyone who has brought labels, the school does appreciate them. The school will continue to collect Box Tops for Education that are found on many products. We had the Spring Pie Day Meeting here at St. John's Ridge Valley. We had 30+ folks from other local Lutheran churches. I would like to thank everyone who baked for the dessert table and also for the school. We supplied 11 desserts. They transported 117 desserts to the school for the evening meal. My guess is that they will last more than one meal! Vicar Micah spoke about the work he is doing at Silver Springs. He is enjoying the children and the children are having fun getting to know him. He does crafts with the kids and plays basketball with them. These social things allow him time to build a relationship with the kids and earn their trust and develop talk about religion. Several children have been baptized this year and Vicar Micah tries to encourage those that want to be baptized to do so in their own church into the life of Christ. That way they can continue their religious experience in a familiar setting once they are discharged from the school. One of the representatives of the school, Robin told us that there are 70 residential children so they have a full house. Two new programs are basketball and cheerleading. This teaches the kids about teamwork and respect for each other. Everyone is very busy, kids, teachers and counselors alike. The free will offering netted \$294.00 and we voted to use the money to update the Children's Residential Rooms. The cost per room is about \$250.00. There are 2 kids per room and each room will get new carpet, paint and art work. The October Pie Day Meeting will be held at the school in Plymouth Meeting. I am willing to drive to the school and if we can get anyone else willing to make the trip we will get to see more of the school and the wonderful work they accomplish. Taking the Fear Out of Estate Planning

Planning for the future and discussing financial matters is unnerving for most of us. But it is not taboo and is not something to put off until later. Estate planning is the preplanning for the work that often is completed in a probate proceeding. Money spent in the estate planning process can reduce the cost

of certain probate proceedings by 80 to 90 percent, not to mention the substantial savings in emotional energy and family harmony.

Estate planning is something that everyone needs to do, with particular emphasis at key points in life, such as marriage, the loss of a loved one, the birth of a child,

or a change in financial situations. I started giving my "what you need to know before talking to your lawyer about estate planning" talk in an effort to educate our community and congregation of the importance of having a plan in place for a lifetime. I have discovered that many in our community know little about estate planning.

Unfortunately, when persons do not have estate plans, there are often disagreements among family members as to what the recent decedent's wishes were. At best, there are arguments and hurt feelings. At worst, there are lawsuits that seldom accomplish more than depleting the estate. I have often worked with spouses of an only child who have had to open probate estates in order to transfer property to themselves when there is no other heir. It involves the court and attorney costs and surety and publication fees, some or all of which can be avoided by a modest prior effort at estate planning.

We become involved in ministries because we agree with their goals and efforts and we wish to contribute to further the goals. But when people are asked to support ministry through planned giving, many persons' eyes glaze over, or they respond by saying, "But I don't have that much." Church leaders should help their members understand various giving methods, and more important, folks should make a little investment of time to educate themselves in these areas. It really doesn't take much money to implement a plan, and what you learn may improve the understanding of your total financial situation.

The purchase of lottery tickets is not estate planning. Start saving early, and the task is so much easier when you designate even a little to savings from every paycheck.

And do what you can to take the fear out of financial planning with your family members and children. Give a gift of savings bonds or a small investment to your youngsters instead of the latest must-have item. One will continue to grow, while the other becomes insignificant or gathers dust.

You can take the fear out of estate planning by finding advisors you can trust. As an attorney, I've found that some of my most fulfilling relationships are the friendships and associations I have developed with other believers. I could mention the elderly persons, who have waited quietly following a meeting or presentation to ask a question of a knowledgeable attorney that they felt they could trust; or the pleasure of being recognized out in the community by church members; or the stress that numerous families have been spared by spending the time to think through, then document their plans and expectations for the time when they are no longer able to direct their affairs.

"You get what you pay for" is a well-known phrase that can be applied to financial investment. Part of our responsibility as good stewards of what we have been given is to put financial plans in place. With God's help and credible advice of trusted leaders and financial advisors, we can do so with confidence. ☺



Newspaper Forts (diycrafts.com)




